- Joyce Davies and Heather Palframan reported that the Strawberry Festival yielded approximately \$300 less than the anticipated amount. PW had a board meeting last night and discussed issues relating to the Christmas Bazaar and Strawberry Festival, proposing some changes for the future.
- David Apy reported for the Manse Task Force that the church will retain architect Matt Cronin, for a fee of \$6,200. He will do the architectural work for the renovation of the manse. Funds will be taken from the church Endowment Fund to pay for this. It was noted that the Manse needs to be in good living condition in order for us to call a new pastor.
- Elder Joel Davies reported that the church received an anonymous donation of \$5,000 which was targeted to Christian Education. Session voted and approved acceptance of the donation.
- Two new committee members were voted and approved to be on the Personnel Committee (David Apy and Ted Dellinger).
- On behalf of the Personnel Committee, Elder Kay Healy-Wedsworth presented a new Interim Pastor Agreement for Tom Robinson's second one year period at PCAS which was voted and approved.
- On behalf of the Worship Committee, Elder Kay Healy-Wedsworth presented the following motions which were voted and approved:
 - ◊ Changing the date of the outdoor worship service from 9/17/17 to 9/24/17.
 - ◊ Rev. Dr. Annari Griesel will serve communion with Rev. Tom on 7/2/17.
 - ◊ There will be guest preachers from July 9-July 23 when Rev. Tom is on vacation.
 - ◊ Starting July 2 and ending September 3, worship service will begin at 9:30 am.
- Sherri Adler reported for the Fellowship Committee that they are excited about the church BBQ/Picnic on June 25. There will be lots of food, games and fellowship.
- Rev. Tom reported that Presbytery met last month in Lincroft and they are discussing the future of Monmouth Presbytery and its executive committee. Next meeting will be at Tower Hill in September.
- Rev. Tom reported on many things, including the progress of the website committee, the Mission Study Team, and his upcoming vacation. Also, Kay Jensen's husband, Carl, passed away and there will be a memorial service at church on August 19.

Session Update from August 2017 Meeting

- We received a request to transfer Mark Palframan's membership to Gardens Presbyterian Church in Palm Beach Gardens, FL.
- Member Burt Ochs sent letters to Session which contained detailed explanations about maintenance issues on the church property, including his recommendations on pruning/removing trees as well as repairs to the road through the cemetery. Chris Kavan and Bill Wikoff (Facilities Co-Chairs) are thankful for Burt's help and will work with him on addressing his concerns.
- Heather Palframan reported that PW is planning a special fundraiser this Fall. Details will be forthcoming. The next PW Board meeting is September 10.
- Joel Davies reported for P&A that pledging and per capita contributions are falling behind and we will make a request to ask members to get current on their pledges.
- Joel Davies also reported that the manse committee is waiting for a report from the architect on repairs and renovations to be done.
- The Personnel committee proposed hiring Pat Dunphy as music director for a children's choir and the motion was approved. Practices begin September 17.
- Bonnie Tortora reported for Fellowship that the picnic in June was a huge success. Also, Small Groups will be starting up again this Fall.
- The worship committee set the date of April 29, 2018 for the next Women's Service.
- Sherri Adler reported for Christian Education the following:
 - ◊ VBS had low signups so it was canceled
 - ◊ September 10 will be Rally Day/Keansburg Water Park trip
 - ◊ Starting in October, there will be a new confirmation class for children in grades 7+.
- Trish Apy reported for Presbytery that the Monmouth Presbytery is considering restructuring with other presbyteries due to declining membership.
- Reverend Tom reported that tonight was the last day of his first term as interim pastor. He spent a few minutes reviewing the highlights of his first year with PCAS. He is happy to report that the church should have a new website by the end of the summer.



Congregation Heritage Celebration

Who doesn't like to hear a story? Who among us does not have a story to tell?

After worship on September 24, we will have an opportunity to share our stories with each other and rediscover our congregation's personality. There are many things we will do on the path to new ministry and this is one of them.

Each of us can help shine some light on what our congregation's values are and what makes the church valuable to us. It is through sharing and collecting these stories that we hope to identify where we as members of our congregation have been and where we choose to go. It is a time to celebrate who we are as the congregation of the Presbyterian Church at Shrewsbury.

It does not matter whether the story you share is simple or profound. Even the simplest memories can capture a whole lot of meaning, and no single story can capture it all. Our memories of events and experiences express the togetherness we have as a congregation and our relationship with God.

You can tell a story about what brought you to the Church. You can share a memory of an activity that was important to you or your family. It can be about a person that helped or inspired you. It can be funny. It can be serious. That's up to you.

You can share something that provides inspiration to you. You can share God's call to you. Just as God's calling to each of us is individual, sharing will help us understand how we respond to that call and where we, as His Church, could be going. If there are activities you are already doing, sharing those activities may inspire others to follow you.

There are no right or wrong answers, just our feelings and God's call to us on a personal level. It is a time for celebration.

This sharing activity will occur directly after the outside worship service on the 24th. Both the worship service and heritage celebration are planned to move quickly. Then, as expected of a Presbyterian Congregation, we will share a Pot Luck lunch. And the story telling will probably continue. There will be a sign-up board in the Church House Lobby for pot luck dishes. The memories are up to you.

This activity is just the start of several activities that will continue throughout the Fall. Ultimately, the information gathered will provide guidance for us to choose a new Pastor and guidance for that person's choice to join us. Some of you have already expressed interest in participating. All are welcome to join us.

Peace Offering

For most of my life I have thought of PEACE as the opposite of war, conflict, fighting, violence in whatever form. And therefore PEACEMAKING efforts should be directed to not only bringing an end to these physical things but , if funds are raised, these would be sent to a war zone to aid victims, helping those displaced. Now with a few years under my belt I am wiser and take a much broader view. I consider all of the root causes of unrest that often lead to frustration and that in turn lead to an absence of PEACE, even if not physical violence, are impediments to PEACE. So now I include poverty, injustice, discrimination, racism, disenfranchisement, and more as legitimate targets for PEACEMAKING efforts. When large numbers of people are affected, efforts to rectify these root cause of their disaffection are legitimate targets of PEACEMAKING efforts. And so

Each year our denomination collects the PEACE offering on the first Sunday in October, this year October 1. This is also Worldwide Communion Sunday.

Rev. Tom recently referred to PEACE as "the restoration of broken pieces." Here is a way each of us can help.

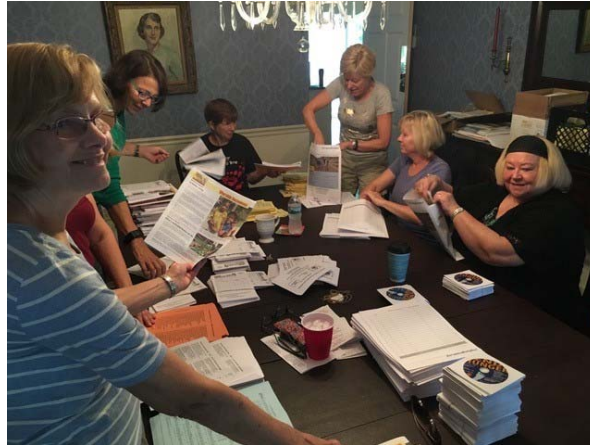

ARE YOU
WHAT YOUR CHURCH IS DOING WITH YOUR TIME, TALENT, AND TREASURE?

Christmas is just over the horizon. Another *Towne Crier* page is due. In search of something suitably poetic, elegiac, I Googled “September”. I had in mind Frost, but if I’d thought harder, I’d have remembered that Frost can bite – and what I really was looking for, I sheepishly admit, was Hallmark. What I found were endless unmemorable words responding to 9/11. I might have anticipated this, but I was lost in my reverie of kids going back to school and the beach crowds going home. So many associations, so varied, sent me spinning through my Rolodex of memory, settling on Auden, from his poem *September 1, 1939*, when marching Nazis launched started a war.

*All I have is a voice
To undo the folded lie,
The romantic lie in the brain
Of the sensual man-in-the-street
And the lie of Authority
Whose buildings grope the sky:
There is no such thing as the State
And no one exists alone;
Hunger allows no choice
To the citizen or the police;
We must love one another or die.*



Auden grew to dislike his poem, and changed the last line of the stanza to “We must love one another and die”. For Auden, despair won out. Later, he barred publication.

What, you ask, has this to do with Stewardship? In these uncertain times, in a sea of distractions and diversions, dreamy afternoons vacationing by the sea, restless nights fretting over hells of fire and fury, idle hours pondering what’s ahead for the

Presbyterian Church At Shrewsbury – we children of God, the church, us, you and me – we are called to focus. And to act. We must love one another or die, surely. We must also remember to keep up with our pledges. To do its work, this church must pay its bills, and counts on your pledges to do so. If your situation is fraught, and you need to adjust your estimate of giving, please let us know so that we might adjust our plans.

We have work ahead, tasks large and small, national and personal. This is not the time for despair, not the time to sit and watch. Give until it hurts, and then give a little more – of your time, of your talent, of your treasure. Honor your word, and fulfill your pledge. *Be* the church, and help create this church discover its mission.
