A MESSAGE FROM P&A ON THE BUDGET

“We Need Your Help”

Change is hard. It can test our resolve and we can sometimes hedge our bets in response. But Christ is not a bet, it is a commitment. For life.

As the Church enters the final quarter of the year, we find ourselves in difficult financial circumstances. We as a Church adopted a budget that anticipated a \$5,000 deficit. Unfortunately, P&A was overly optimistic as to non-pledge income, which reflects those who give but do not pledge. P&A estimated \$30,000 in non-pledge income, but as of the end of August we had received less than \$15,000, which is not good given general giving patterns. At this rate, P&A is concerned that the deficit for the year could exceed \$20,000.

As we head into fall and soon thereafter Advent, we encourage each and every member to prayerfully consider whether God is calling us to commit to increasing a weekly pledge between now and the end of the year, or just making an additional one-time contribution, whether \$50, \$250, or \$1,000 (or any other amount).

As a congregation we can be proud of our collective efforts over the last year and a half during this time of transition, but the reality is clear that as a congregation we need to dig deeper. With your faith and commitment to God, all things are possible.

Session

Session Update from the September Meeting

Below is a summary of what was discussed at our September 18 Session Meeting. If you have any questions please contact Gretchen or any other member of Session.

- Clerk Gretchen O’Kane reported that 5 current Session members have terms which are expiring at the end of 2017. Also, we have had one open position on Session so we will have the Nominating Committee start working on finding people to fill those slots. There will also be Deacon slots to be filled.
- Jim Wright reported for the Deacons that they are working on a visitation system and schedule so our elders and shut-ins can all have regular visits.
- Heather Palframan reported for PW that they have a fundraiser in the works. Also, PW is looking for chairpeople for the Christmas Bazaar. The Thank Offering will occur on November 19. Elder Bonnie Tortora reported that the social room kitchen (behind the sanctuary) has mice. In the future, people need to be careful when cleaning up after coffee hour and receptions.
- Elder Kirsten Schanck (for the Church & Society Committee) showed a preview of a slideshow which will be shown to the congregation on October 22 at our Outreach Ministry Worship Service.
- David Apy reported for the Manse committee that they will be meeting with the architect to finalize the design and then the work will be priced out. He will bring an update to Session in October.
- David Apy reported for P&A that church finances are “grim”. At this point in time there is a deficit of \$20K-\$30K. We’ve had some unplanned expenses but also giving is lagging. Members will be asked to catch up on pledges and committees were asked to refrain from spending if possible.
- David Apy reported for Personnel that they had a meeting in June and will meet again in October.
- Elder Jules Plangere brought the following 3 motions from the Worship committee which were all approved:
 - ◇ Blue Christmas service will be held December 6.
 - ◇ Advent worship service will be held December 13
 - ◇ Christmas Pageant will occur on December 10 during Worship Service.

- Elder Sherri Adler reported for Christian Education that postcards were mailed out to the neighborhood. Also, CE is applying for a Monmouth Presbytery Vitality Grant which would fund an Autism Spectrum Inclusiveness Initiative that our church would like to offer. Session approved the application.
- Elder Trish Apy provided dates for the next few Presbytery meetings:
 - ◊ September 26 at Brick. The focus will be on social media.
 - ◊ October 24 at Tower Hill – a workshop format
 - ◊ November 18 at East Brunswick with Jim Hawkins from Washington D.C. discussing social justice issues
- Pastor Robinson said the mission study survey will be coming out soon. Also, he shared many of his activities in the last month. He requested that the lighting in his office be addressed as it is extremely dark in there and difficult to work in the space.

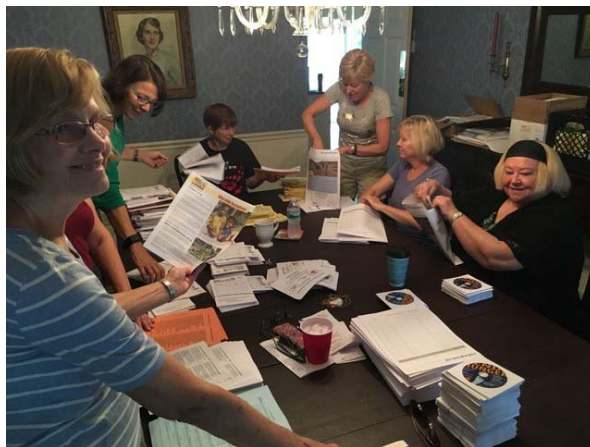
Sunday October 22nd - Celebration of PCAS Outreach Ministry

STEWARDSHIP

ARE YOU
~~WHAT YOUR CHURCH IS~~ DOING WITH YOUR TIME, TALENT, AND TREASURE?

It's Stewardship Season! What better way to kick it off and to concentrate the mind than with a financial problem. Elsewhere in this newsletter you'll read that P&A reported to Session that church finances are "grim", with a current year deficit approaching \$30,000. This big, red hole in the accounts is due, says P&A, to unplanned expenses, and to lagging in giving – some of us are behind on what we pledged. Sit with that thought for a minute. Maybe two minutes – it's a big thought. Keep in mind that the "church" isn't the place where some of us go on Sunday. It isn't the building. It isn't the balance sheet. If you're reading this, the church is you.

Ask yourself who should be doing what to fill the hole in the accounts. If you're behind on your pledge, then maybe the answer is straightforward. Maybe it isn't – life can be complicated and maybe you've had some unplanned expenses of your own; maybe your income is lagging. If you're up-to-date on giving, do you see this as someone else's problem to resolve, or does it fall to you, as a member of the church, to consider what you might do to sustain The Church? We might ask ourselves what the church means to us, why we're here, and what it would mean if we weren't -- what it would mean if the church were not here. What do we – the church – mean in the world? It's the same old question; it never goes away. Be grateful for that.



Step back, and take a look at where we are. Rev. McKirachan retired last year, and guided by Rev. Robinson, we're making our way through the process of finding our mission, and finding a new pastor. It's a time of change, of risk, of opportunity. The choices we make will determine who we are as a church, and where we're going. Or if we're going at all. Nothing now or in the future guarantees the survival of this institution, our church. Nothing – except our choices. We have challenges – some of

them financial, and some much larger. Having access to the bullion depository at Fort Knox might allow us to pay the bills, but that's only the beginning, only a pre-condition for survival, necessary but not sufficient.

The challenge presented by our finances is the same challenge presented by our mission study – who we are as a church, who we are as citizens, and more simply, who we are. Ask yourself. Ask yourself, too, what it means.
